

Dear Friends in the Lord, It has been a tough week here at St. John's.

On Holy Saturday Gaetano "Guy" Corso passed away. As you know, for many, many years Guy was a significant part of our parish family. His presence at nearly every parish event and, particularly, his service at nearly every Mass was one of the constants here on Temple Street. Much to his personal detriment, Guy served our country with distinction. His service to us at St. John's was also distinctive. We have missed him being here for the past couple of years. We are confident that he now knows the mercy and love of God to whom he was so dedicated. Guy's Funeral Mass will be celebrated at 10:00 a.m. on Monday morning. Following the Mass he will be buried at St. John's Cemetery with his parents.

In similar but far more shocking news, Fr. Jim Hoev was born into eternal life on Thursday, his 79th birthday. Fr. Jim had suffered a massive stroke on Tuesday. In his few vears with us Fr. Jim made a strong impression and was enormously helpful, especially to me. I am, of course, saddened and shocked at his passing. Still, I continue to reflect upon how happy he was throughout Holy Week and Easter. Fr. Jim loved the Lord and loved the priesthood and he wanted all of us to love in the same deep manner. Despite the grief, even with the loss we experience. I cannot help but be thrilled for him. Fr. Jim celebrated the Paschal Mystery with great care and deep joy – and then went off to heaven! At this time, we are unaware of his funeral arrangements. I am quite sure that the funeral will be held at Mary, Queen of the Rosary Parish in Spencer where he served for so well and for so long.

This was not the best Easter week in our parish's history. Still, I found it instructive. One thing that I have mentioned – many, many times – is how interesting I find the Gospel on Easter Sunday. We get all dressed up to celebrate the most important feast of the year and all that we hear in the Gospel is Mary Magdalene tell the apostles: "They have taken the Lord from the tomb, and we don't know where they have put him." It is only during Easter week and the fifty days of the Easter season that we hear that Jesus appears to them and inspires in them that He is Risen. Through this week and this season we, too, renew our own faith in the Resurrection. We, too, come to experience that He lives. By the grace of God, this renewal occurs most deeply as we endure the loss and the death which remains a part of everyone's life. We trust that Guy and Fr. Jim rest in the peace of Christ and await us in the heavenly kingdom
