

Dear Friends in the Lord.

It has been said – by Richard Rohr, O.F.M. if I remember correctly – that all our problems are psychological in their root and that the root of all their solutions is spiritual. I am not sure if I agree completely with the first part, but I am in unequivocal agreement with the second part.

The challenge, though, is that spiritual solutions come slowly. The consolation is that they do, indeed, come. The Scriptures always present us with a challenge and a consolation. Today they ask us to reflect on the challenge and consolation which comes with the sometimes slow but always certain action of God.

We believe that Jesus "is the Alpha and the Omega." It is the "time between" that tests our patience! Today's readings use the images of forestry and farming to express the good news. Jesus' parables often make reference to planting and growing. In today's Parable of the Mustard Seed Jesus builds on Ezekiel's image of a majestic cedar in the first reading. He points out how something as tiny as a seed grows into something so much larger than itself. Jesus invites us to see that this is the work of God. St. Paul understood this invitation and encourages us to "walk by faith and not by sight."

What is critical here, I think, is that we understand our role in this process. Our mission is to plant and till. God is responsible for the success of the mission. "God gives the increase." Which likewise reminds us of the patience that is required. We cannot merely, passively, sit around and wait. We must tend to the soil, plant the seeds and care for them. If so, "through it all the seed will sprout and grow. We know not how."

Finally, I wanted to offer a gentle reminder and a subtle request about the Annual Partners in Charity Appeal. For years we have not only met but exceed – some years in a substantial way – our parish goal. This year we still need to donate about \$10,000 to meet the goal. I guess I could be a bit more patient since the drive does not conclude until the end of August. Still, I want to encourage anyone who has not made a gift/pledge to please consider doing so. The appeal is needed for the Diocese to continue to offer its many services to the people of Worcester County. Thank you.
